

Magyar Radiológia: Instructions for Authors

Magyar Radiológia is the professional, educational and scientific, peer-reviewed journal of the Hungarian Society of Radiology. The primary focus of the journal are the fields of diagnostic imaging and interventional radiology, and related medical and natural sciences. We welcome manuscripts meeting the formal requirements set out below, written in Hungarian or English. The journal will first publish all accepted communications in the online edition (MRO), followed by the print version of some of the articles. All peer-reviewed papers for publication will be reviewed by an anonymous peer-reviewer and editor. Publication will occur after discussion of the results of peer-review with the authors, after making the modifications deemed necessary. 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The title of the manuscript, the abstract and the keywords should be sent in both English and Hungarian for all submissions. *Original manuscript:* Conveys new information based on clinical and experimental work conducted by the authors. The English and Hungarian language abstract should be provided with subheadings (introduction, patients and methods, results, discussion), in a structured format. The maximum length of the communication is 18 pages (4500 words) without figures. Potential exceptions to this length limit should be negotiated with the editorial office before the submission.

Methodological manuscript: Demonstration and assessment of a novel technique, or methodological improvement. Parts of the manuscript are aims, description of the method, and discussion. For methodological papers a structured abstract is not required, but the key elements of the method should be described in both English and Hungarian. The maximum length of the communication is 9 pages (2250 words) without figures. Potential exceptions to this length limit should be negotiated with the editorial office before the submission.

Case study: Presentation and evaluation of one (or more) clinical case. The case presentation includes: introduction, description of the case, conclusions. The abstract

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Parts of the manuscript:

1. Title page: Title of the paper (maximum 80 characters), full names of all authors, working address (institute, department, etc.) in English, postal address of the corresponding author, e-mail address, mobile phone and fax number. It should be indicated whether the corresponding author consents to publication of their contact details beyond the postal address.
2. Summary (structured abstract): Based on the type of submission, it should be made with minimum length of 150 and maximum length of 250 words respectively. The English language summary should begin with the title.

- Bibliography (all references should be cited in the text)
